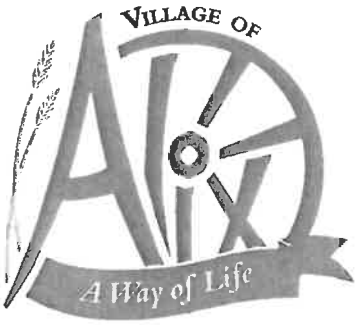

1. **PURPOSE** – To review Policy No. 29: Electronic Sign.
2. **BACKGROUND** – This policy was approved in 2013 and is due for review.
3. **OPTIONS** –

4. **DISCUSSION** – We use the sign to promote and advertise the Village and anything that may be happening in our community.
5. **FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS** – The previous policy stated we would charge a fee of \$25 per 7 days of advertising to non-profit groups/organizations and \$100 per 7 days for commercial and profit-based businesses or groups. The new policy states there will be no charge for non-profit groups/organizations and a \$25 fee per 30 days for commercial and profit businesses to advertise.

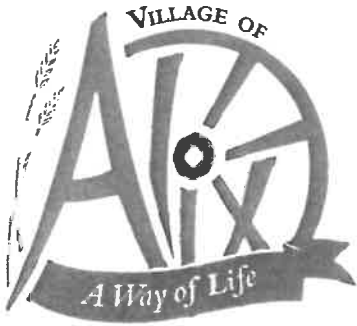

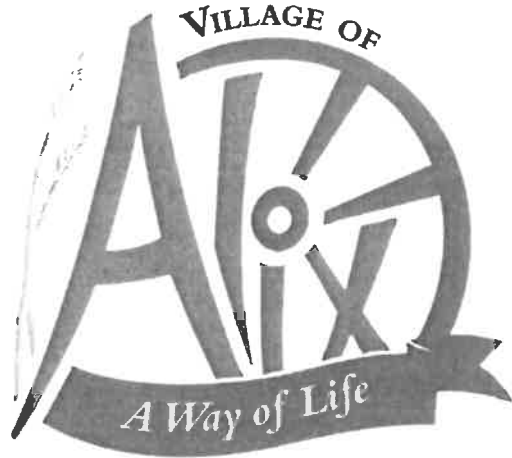

Buffalo Lake Management Team

June 19, 2023

Project Updates:

- a) Invasive Species-to date no carp have been detected in Buffalo Lake or Gull Lake. Gull Lake Watershed society have been testing a filter that would allow pumping to resume while keeping carp out of the lake. Most recent small and large scale tests have been 100% successful in filtering out the eggs.
- b) Concerns raised about the difference in water pressure from the pump at Gull Lake vs the pump for Buffalo Lake (40% more pressure at Buffalo)
- c) Carlin Soehn from Alberta Environment stated that Fish and Wildlife was not satisfied with the results yet.
- d) Buffalo lake level is lower than it has ever been. It is 38 cm below the pumping trigger elevation. Pumping would have started in early May if it was not suspended.

Old Business:

- a) Docks and Lifts -The grant application for shared dock for EMS, RCMP and Fish and Wildlife was denied so the new dock will be put on hold until funding can be secured.
- b) Rochon Sands Berm- WSP has been retained and has started working on it
- c) White Sands Boat Launch- three or four pads are missing due to the ice break up this spring. Likely closed for the season as there is not enough water to use it.

New Business:

What's up at Rochon Sands and What's up at White Sands have maps that show the trouble spots and low areas on Buffalo Lake to help boaters use the lake safely.

CAO REPORT JULY 2023

1. Alberta Agriculture and Irrigation – Since the election, various ministries have been re-named and portfolios have shifted. Formerly under Alberta Environment and Parks, Alberta Agriculture and Irrigation under the leadership of Minister RJ Sigurdson is responsible for policies, legislation, regulations and services necessary for Alberta’s agriculture and food sectors. Inspiring public confidence in the quality and safety of food and supporting environmentally sustainable resource management practices.

The Village was recently approached by two members of the Ag and Irrigation Operations Department about a proposal to do work to the Alix Lake Outlet on the north side of Highway 12. The plan is to remove vegetation and re-slope the banks within the Environmental Reserve on either side of the water body.

We stated our appreciation for notification of the project and thanked them very much for their landscaping enhancement initiative.
