



### Alberta Jobs Now program

The Alberta Jobs Now program will provide up to 370 million to help private and non-profit businesses with job supports to get thousands of Albertans back to work.

Employers can apply for funding to offset the cost of hiring and training unemployed or underemployed Albertans in new or vacant positions.

#### Employers can:

- Apply for up to 20 fulltime new hires per intake period.
  - First intake: May 20<sup>th</sup> – August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2021
  - Second intake September 15<sup>th</sup> – December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2021
  - Third intake: TBA

## Enhanced COVID-19 Business Benefit

Starting mid-April, the Enhanced COVID-19 Business Benefit will provide payments of up to \$10,000 to eligible small and medium business most affected by the pandemic and ongoing public health restrictions.

Businesses can use these funds as they see fit to help offset the costs of re-opening, and implementing public health measures including:

- Physical Barriers
- Purchasing personal protective equipment (PPE) and disinfecting supplies
- Paying rent and employee wages
- Replacing Inventory
- Expanding online business or e-commerce opportunities

### **Funding**

Canadian Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS) – You may be eligible for wage subsidy to cover part of your employee wages.

Extended until June 5<sup>th</sup>, 2021 Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS) - Canada.ca

Canada Emergency Business Account (CEBA) – The CEBA program provides interest free loans of up to \$60,000 to small businesses and not-for-profits. Repaying the balance of the loan on or before December 31st, 2022 will result in loan forgiveness of 33 percent (up to \$20,000) Open until **June 30th**, **2021.**

<u>Canada Emergency Business</u> <u>Account (CEBA) (ceba-cuec.ca)</u>

Work Sharing Program – this is a program that helps employers and employees avoid layoffs when there is a temporary decrease in business activity beyond the control of the employers. This will provide Employment Insurance (EI) benefits to eligible employees who agree to reduce their normal working hours and share the available work while their employer recovers.
