To help in your decision making, here is an overview of what's been happening so far in 2024.



#### **Lagoon Capital Project**

The lagoon (municipal wastewater treatment facility) is looking great and working even better! Two of the big holding cells now have a synthetic liner in them to stop any leaks or vegetation growth. Many of the valves and manholes between the holding cells are new and two of our small primary cells have been de-sludged so the system will work properly. There is a new fence around the new big cells to keep wildlife out. We would like to put synthetic liner in our small primary cells as well but are waiting to see if we get a grant to cover the cost.

This project cost approx. \$4.2 million to get to this stage. \$3,184,095 of that was grant funding, the remaining \$1 million came from tax dollars.

## **Lake Dredging**

Phase 1 of lake dredging was completed this spring. The boat launch and swim area had all the vegetation and sludge removed back down to the sandy/rocky lake bottom. The swim area was also deepened a bit and about 10 feet past the buoys was done to help keep the vegetation back. Phase 1 cost \$90,719 and was funded from tax dollars. If Council goes ahead with phase 2 of the project, a large area in the middle of the lake would be deepened. The cost of phase 2 is approx. \$300,000. We would look for partnerships and grants to help with the

cost, but it is likely that at least half would be funded by tax dollars.

### **Subdivision Lift Station Capital Project**

The existing building was used to save costs, but everything inside and underground was replaced. This project is budgeted for \$885,000 with \$488,000 of that coming from grants. The remaining \$397,000 came from tax dollars. Completing this project means there is only one lift station in Alix left to replace/upgrade – all the rest are considered "new" and working great!
